Elaine Zieroth, Forest Supervisor, has decided authorize Energy West/PacificCorp to
occupy National Forest System lands to conduct a helicopter-assisted coal drilling
program from July 29 to October 1, 2002. The project will consist of eight core holes
drilled in Crandall Canyon, Mill Fork Canyon, and upper Joes Valley. The purpose of the
drilling is to further analyze seam characteristics and thickness. The drill holes would be
located within the current Utah Coal Lease ML-48258, Sections 10, 12, 13, 15, and 22 of
T.16S., R.6E; and Sections 6 and 7, T.16 South R.7E., SLM, Emery County, Utah. The
drilling will occur on lands in which the surface is administered by the United States Forest
Service and the subsurface by the Utah School and Institutional Trust Lands Administration
(SITLA).

As the coal estate owner, SITLA has an outstanding right to develop coal reserves in the
tract and occupancy of the land surface needed to evaluate the minability of coal reserves.
The Forest Supervisor, Manti-La Sal National Forest, will issue a Special use Permit
authorizing surface occupancy and stipulating conditions needed to protect non-mineral
resources. A Forest Service Road-Use Permit will also be issued to authorize use of
Forest Roads.

stipulations are needed for the protection of non-coal resources.

All the new disturbed area (approximately 0.23 acres) for the Link Canyon Portal facility
is located within the present approved Permit area. Sediment control, reclamation, and
 revegetation of the Link Canyon Portal would be done the same way as for other portal
breakouts approved in the MRP. The Site would be reclaimed when no longer needed for
mining.
