Under the Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act of 1977 (30 U.S.C. 1201 et seq. SMCRA), the Western Regional Office-Denver of the U. S. Office of Surface Mining (OSM) gives notice of the availability of a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) and environmental assessment (EA) prepared for a Federal mining plan modification in Utah. This action involves a proposal by PacifiCorp to construct new surface facilities in conjunction with the Deer Creek underground coal mine in Rilda Canyon on Federal coal leases with the surface land managed by the Manti-La Sal National Forest. The proposed action in Rilda Canyon is located in Section 28, T. 16 S., R. 7 E, SLM, Emery County, Utah.

PacifiCorp submitted a permit application package (PAP) for a permit revision for the Deer Creek Mine to the Utah Department of Natural Resources, Division of Oil, Gas and Mining (UT-DOG M). The PAP proposed constructing mine portals, a mine ventilation fan, an office/bathhouse/warehouse facility, and other associated surface support facilities on 13 acres of Federal coal leases U-06039, U-2810, SL-050862, and SL-051221. UT-DOG M approved the permit revision on July 27, 2005. Under the Mineral Leasing Act of 1920, the Assistant Secretary, Land and Minerals Management, must approve, approve with conditions, or disapprove the mining plan modification for the Federal leases. OSM is recommending approval of the mining plan modification without special conditions.

The FONSI is based on the EA dated June 24, 2005, titled *Deer Creek Coal Mine, Mining Plan Modification, Federal Coal Leases U-06039, U-2810, SL-050862, and SL-051221, Emery County, Utah*, prepared by OSM and UT-DOG M in cooperation with the U. S. Forest Service and the Bureau of Land Management. Copies of the documents can be obtained from the U.S. Office of Surface Mining/DOI, Western Regional Office, Program Support Division, P.O. Box 46667, Denver, Colorado 80201-6667.

A notice of intent for the following project submitted in accordance with \$R307-401-1, Utah Administrative Code (UAC), has been received for consideration by the Executive Secretary, Utah Air Quality Board:

Company Name: XTO Energy, Inc.
Location: The Huntington Plant, UTM Coordinates 466.520 km East
4,355.220 km North, Zone 12

Project Description: XTO Energy operates a compressor station consisting of a 530 horse powered compressor engine, two dehydration units, an amine unit and four tank heaters for the Huntington natural gas processing facility located in Emery County, which is an attainment area of the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for all pollutants. The company has requested to replace the natural gas engine with up to five electric motors. New Source Performance Standards (NSPS), National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) and Maximum Available Control Technology (MACT) regulations do not apply to this source. Title V of the 1990 Clean Air Act does not apply to this source. The current emissions, in tons per year, are as follows: NO_x 8.95, CO 7.51, VOC 9.95, and HAPs 0.80. The proposed emission changes are: PM₁₀ 0.04, NO_x 0.55, CO 0.46, VOC 9.95 and HAPs -0.27. The changes in emissions will result in the following, in tons per year, potential to emit totals: PM₁₀ = 0.04, NO_x = 9.50, CO = 7.97, VOC = 19.90, and HAPs = 0.53.

The completed engineering evaluation and air quality impact analysis showed that the proposed project meets the requirements of federal air quality regulations and the State air quality rules. The Executive Secretary intends to issue an Approval Order pending a 10-day public comment period. The project proposal, estimate of the effect on local air quality and draft Approval Order are available for public inspection and comment at the Utah Division of Air Quality, 150 North 1950 West, Salt Lake City, UT 84114-4820. Written Comments received by the Division at this same address on or before August 26, 2005, will be considered in making the final decision on the approval/disapproval of the proposed approval order. Email comments will also be accepted at ehe@utah.gov. If anyone so requests to the Executive Secretary at the Division in writing within 10 days of publication of this notice, a hearing will be held in accordance with R307-401-4, UAC.
