PacifiCorp, by and through its wholly-owned subsidiary, Energy West Mining Company ("Energy West") as mine operator, hereby submits two copies of the exploration data compiled from the "2008 Mill Fork Drilling Program" (State Lease ML-48258), including lithologic logs, geophysical logs (compact disk), coal quality analyses and report of water observed. Drilling commenced on June 19, 2008 and was completed on July 26, 2008. A total of five holes were drilled detailing the geologic and hydrologic characteristics of coal reserves in State Lease ML-48258. The following summary outlines the drill hole information submitted along with the hole abandonment documentation:

Each of the five (5) sites were reclaimed and seeded according to U.S.F.S. specifications upon completion.
