East Mountain Logical Mining Unit Modification 9 Approved

The East Mountain Logical Mining Unit (LMU) was approved effective December 23, 1986. Partial coal lease relinquishments were approved by this office on March 8, 2006. PacifiCorp has requested that the relinquished lands be excluded from the East Mountain Logical Mining Unit (LMU). This will be Modification 9 to the LMU. The intent of this decision is to formally approve this modification.

Modification 9, deletes lands, consisting of 2,490.00 acres as the result of the partial relinquishments of Federal coal leases UTSL-070645-02290, UTU-040151, UTU-083066, UTU-084923 and UTU-1358. The Public Notice of Availability was published in the Emery County Progress on March 6 and 13, 2012.

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) has determined that this proposed modification is in conformance with the approval criteria as per 43 CFR 3487. Therefore, this modification to the East Mountain Logical Mining Unit is approved effective March 8, 2006. The East Mountain LMU, as modified, now contains 19,853.77 acres.

The East Mountain LMU met diligence on the effective date of the LMU (December 23, 1986). The first continued operation year (COY) began January 1, 1987. The LMU has been and remains in a producing status. The recoverable reserve for the LMU is 103,602,083 tons as stated in a letter dated December 7, 2012. Therefore, for COY 26 (January 1, 2012 – December 31, 2012) the East Mountain LMU must mine 1,036,021 tons. The LMU met this requirement for COY 26 in April 2012.

This decision may be appealed to the Interior Board of Land Appeals, Office of the Secretary, in accordance with the regulations contained in 43 CFR, Part 4, and the enclosed Form 1842.1. If an appeal is taken, your notice of appeal must be filed in this office (at the above address) within 30 days from receipt of this decision. The appellant has the burden of showing that the decision appealed from is in error.


If you wish to file a petition (pursuant to regulation 43 CFR 4.21)(58 FR 4939, January 19, 1993) (request) for a stay (suspension) of the effectiveness of this decision during the time that your appeal is being reviewed by the Board, the petition for a stay must accompany your notice of appeal. A petition for a stay is required to show sufficient justification based on the standards listed below. Copies of the notice of appeal and petition for a stay **must** also be submitted to each party named in this decision and to the Interior Board of Land Appeals and to the appropriate Office of the Solicitor (see 43 CFR 4.413) at the same time the original documents are filed in this office. If you request a stay, you have the burden of proof to demonstrate that a stay should be granted.

Standards for Obtaining a Stay

Except as otherwise provided by law or other pertinent regulation, a petition for a stay of a decision pending appeal shall show sufficient justification based on the following standards:

- (1) The relative harm to the parties if the stay is granted or denied,
- (2) The likelihood of the appellant's success on the merits,
- (3) The likelihood of immediate and irreparable harm if the stay is not granted, and
- (4) Whether the public interest favors granting the stay.
