On November 15, 1978 a meeting was held with the above mentioned people present for the purpose of determining the obligations of Utah Power and Light as a result of a Board Order issued in Cause No. ACT/015/018.

The meeting began by Ron outlining what he interpreted to be the intention of the Board in issuing said order. Two main points were provided for the Order: 1. That Utah Power and Light will provide sufficient reclamation for areas over the Wilberg Mine which are catastrophically affected by mine subsidence, and 2. That Utah Power and Light will provide a means to replace water of equal quality and quantity if and when documented changes in appropriated water flows are shown to exist on East Mountain.

After some discussion of each person's interpretation of the Order, it was agreed that the information and commitments provided by Utah Power and Light should be as follows: 1. A positive statement that reclamation of catastrophically subsided areas will be undertaken by Utah Power and Light. Said statement will include provisions for standards on regrading and revegetation. 2. That Utah Power and Light will monitor surface waters occurring over the Wilberg Mine one time per year, preferably in October. It was agreed that Mr. Crawford would have the opportunity to point out to Utah Power and Light crews doing the initial monitoring, all existing springs which occur on his property. 3. That Utah Power and Light will commit to utilizing one or a combination of methods to replace <sup>appropriated</sup> surface waters which experience reduced water flows as indicated by long-term monitoring information. Alternative methods may include the drilling of wells, the installation of runoff collection systems, pumping from the mine, or diversions of surface waters.

According to Utah Power and Light, the company holds adequate appropriated water rights on East Mountain which could be diverted to replace Mr. Crawford's water.
