Pursuant to your letter of December 4, 1978, and in compliance with the Order entered May 24, 1978, we enclose the amendment to the Wilberg Mine Reclamation Plan.

You will note that in the addendum we have referred to the Subsidence and Hydrology Monitoring Plan heretofore submitted and have agreed to accomplish the monitoring in accordance with that monitoring plan. However, in accordance with the agreement reached when we met with Mr. Wadsworth on November 14, it is understood that Mr. Crawford shall have the opportunity, when good weather comes, to accompany representatives of this company and your staff and point out any water sources which he feels we may have overlooked. In the event such water sources are fully identified, we will also accomplish monitoring of those sources in substantially the same manner as set forth in the plan.

ADDENDUM TO RECLAMATION PLAN
FOR

UTAH POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

WILBERG MINE
Emery County, Utah



By order of the Oil, Gas and Mining Board, subsequent to an evidentiary hearing held May 24, 1978, the following is an addendum to Utah Power & Light Company's reclamation plan submitted in compliance with the State of Utah's Mined Land Reclamation Act.

The notice of intent and reclamation plan submitted by Utah Power & Light in connection with its operations at the Wilberg Mine, Emery County, Utah, under date of September 9, 1977, is hereby to include the following provisions:

1. In the event subsidence of the surface occurs catastrophically above the Wilberg Mine, thereby creating a surface safety hazard, such as significant fractures, bulges or sink holes, UP&LCO will provide sufficient contouring, backfilling, grading and restoration as is feasible to correct the safety hazard created thereby and shall establish on all land that has been disturbed or graded a diverse, effective and permanent vegetative cover of species native to the area.

2. UP&LCO, in cooperation with the staff of the Division

of Oil, Gas and Mining, will establish and maintain an annual monitoring system to determine the appropriated surface waters over the Wilberg Mine and the flow therefrom. In the event the hydrologic system is disturbed by the operations of UP&LCO to the extent that appropriated surface water is measurably diminished, UP&LCO will replace the amount of surface waters lost as a result of such diminishment either by the drilling of wells or by diversion of existing springs on East Mountain to which UP&LCO holds water rights. Alternate methods may include the installation of runoff collection systems, pumping from the mines or pumping from Cottonwood or Huntington Creeks utilizing water shares owned by UP&LCO.

The monitoring of the surface waters shall be accomplished in accordance with the Subsidence and Hydrology Monitoring Plan heretofore submitted to the United States Geological Survey, the Office Surface Mining and the Division of Oil, Gas and Mining. A copy of said monitoring plan is annexed hereto.
