Dear Mr. Smith:

The Utah Preservation Office has received a copy of the Cottonwood Lease modification for the Wilberg Mine. Our office has reviewed the material provided concerning cultural resources.

The material states that there are very few sites above the 7,000 foot contour in the property area, and is referring to surveys conducted by AERC over a period of years.

There is no specific reference to any potential effects of any known cultural resources, or whether or not the project area has been surveyed. The Office of Surface Mining may request an explanation in this area. This information is provided as guidance to the Division of Oil, Gas & Mining, considering only questions that may be raised by the Office of Surface Mining.

Since no formal consultation request concerning eligibility, effect or mitigation as outlined by 36 CFR 800 was indicated by you, this letter represents a response for information concerning location of cultural resources. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact me at 533-7039.
