On May 11, 1983 a partial inspection of the Wilberg Mine was conducted by DOGM Field Specialist Ken Wyatt. Val Payne accompanied this inspector during the field tour. The weather was cold and windy with intermittent snow showers.

The south Wilberg portal entries have been developed but not finalized. At this time the bin wall was still being erected to support the portal pad. Straw bales have been implemented in the lower reaches of the undisturbed diversion channel which drains the canyon above the south portals. This ditch was being adequately maintained. The design for this undisturbed drainage system calls for a culvert to channel undisturbed runoff from above the portals down into the diversion channel along the southwest side of the access road which subsequently drains into the undisturbed bypass system.

The proposed disturbed area drainage for the South Wilberg portals includes a drop drain on the portal pad and a culvert to drain this runoff down into the disturbed area runoff ditch along the northeast side of the access road. These facilities will be examined on future inspections.

The fan access road reclamation as approved on November 2, 1982 is to be conducted this spring. Dave Lof, previous inspector at the Wilberg mine, indicated that Emery Mining Company agreed to have this work completed by the end of spring (June 21, 1983). Future inspections will assess this reclamation work. No compliance problems were encountered during this inspection.
