Dear Mr. Whitehead:

At the present time, a remote sealing operation is in progress at the Wilberg Mine intake portals. The purpose of the sealing is to control "hot spots" remaining from the December, 1984 fire.

The sealing operation requires a batching plant facility on-site. The batch plant, in turn, requires a source of water and electricity. The attached map shows the location of the plant, the water pipeline and the electrical line. The locations were selected to minimize the conflict with normal mine operations and to reduce the chances of the waterline and electrical line being damaged by said operations. It is anticipated that the batch plant will be required until October 1st, 1986. Upon completion of the sealing project, the plant and all related facilities will be removed.

The facilities have been inspected by DOGM, Field Specialist Philip Ralphs. This material is submitted for your information. If you have questions or comments please call me.


