Dear Mr. Holbrook:

We have reviewed Utah Power and Light Company's Surface Drainage Collection System map (OM-10372-WB), which was submitted as abatement for Notice of Violation N86-9-2-2, and N85-2-21-4, Part 4 of 4.

The changes which have already been approved by OSM and DOGM lie off-lease within the Forest Service Special-Use Permit Area.

Since we have no problems with the proposed modifications and no significant surface disturbance will be necessary, there will be no need to hold up construction. Utah Power and Light must, however, submit a special-use permit modification application to the Forest Service as soon as possible. The existing special-use permit will be modified accordingly.

Please notify Utah Power and Light Company that they must submit this application and make sure that all future modifications to facilities which lie off-lease in Forest Service Special-Use Permit Areas are processed accordingly. }7
