Re: Monitoring of Springs Requested by U.S. Forest Service, East Mountain Spring Monitoring Plan, Utah Power and Light Company, Cottonwood/Wilberg Mines, ACT/015/019-86A, Folder #2, Emery County, Utah

The Manti-LaSal National Forest has responded to the questions enumerated in Tom Munson's May 11, 1988 memorandum. The memo identified six springs of uncertain status that the USFS wanted added to the Utah Power and Light Company's (UP&L) Spring Monitoring Program.

Attached is the Forest Service letter of December 12, 1988, indicating after field verification, the following springs should be added to the East Mountain Spring Monitoring Program.

No. 41      Alpine Spring  
No. 57      Flag Lake Spring

Please provide an amended East Mountain Spring Monitoring plan for the Cottonwood/Wilberg and Deer Creek Mine plans, which incorporates the addition of these two springs.
