Recently, the issue of placement of mine permit identification signs has been raised due to their location on county road rights-of-way or encroachment areas at the Cottonwood/Wilberg Mine Waste Rock Storage Facility and at the Deer Creek Mine.

I spoke with Rex Funk, supervisor for Emery County Roads, on January 17, 1990 about the confusion and possible conflicts that are occurring. He stated that there are certain requirements for the signs and signs precluding access is not allowed in encroachments. Identification signs, according to our regulations, must be located at each point of access from public roads to facilities on permit areas.

Recommendations

Mr. Funk suggested that I (or someone from the Division) meet with him to discuss specifics and visit the area in question. I think this is a good approach to resolution of this problem. Please advise.
