ORDER & FINDINGS
of
PERMIT DEFICIENCY

PERMIT NUMBER ACT/015/019
DIVISION ORDER # DO-91A

PURSUANT to R614-303-212, the DIVISION ORDERS the PERMITTEE, PacifiCorp Electric Operations, to make the permit changes enumerated in the findings of permit deficiency in order to be in compliance with the State Coal Program. These findings of permit deficiency are to be remedied in accordance with R614-303-220.

Findings of Permit Deficiency

According to R614-301-513.200 impoundments and sediment ponds meeting the size and other qualifying criteria of MSHA, 30 CFR 77.216(a) must comply with the requirements of MSHA, 30 CFR 77.216 (see R614-3001-533.600, R614-301-742.222 and R614-301-742.223). MSHA criteria includes:

- 1) Impound water, sediment, or slurry to an elevation of five feet or more above the upstream toe of the structure and can have a storage volume of 20 acre-feet or more; or
- 2) Impound water, sediment, or slurry to an elevation of 20 feet or more above the upstream toe of the structure;
or
- 3) As determined by the District Manager, present a hazard to coal miners.

As-builts of the sediment pond at the Cottonwood/Wilberg Mine were reviewed on June 3, 1991. During this review, the current outlet works as shown in the as-built drawings (7704-C125 and


7704-C126) indicated that both ponds impound water, sediment, or slurry to an elevation of 20 feet or more.

PacifiCorp Electric Operations, Fuel Resources Department is Ordered to make the following permit changes:

- 1) Both ponds will meet all the sizing and monitoring requirements spelled out under MSHA, 30 CFR 77.216(a) and will have a principal and emergency spillway that in combination will safely pass a 100-year, 6-hour precipitation event per the requirements of R614-301-742.222.
- 2) The as-built drawings only show the outlet works and do not show the actual pond contours. An as-built drawing of both ponds showing as-built contours must be supplied with contours using two foot intervals. Elevations for sediment levels, storm volumes, and peak flows will be shown.
- 3) Pond #1 and #2 - A stage discharge curve is referenced on page 8 of Appendix XIII in the PAP but was not found. This information must be supplied along with calculations which include dewatering scenarios to verify detention time based on revised MSHA sizing criteria.
- 4) All decant elevations will adhere to State Health's criteria of at least two feet above the 60 percent sediment clean-out level and 18 inches above maximum sediment level. All decant elevations are currently set at the 60 percent clean-out level as shown on Plate 7704-C125 and 7704-C126. This is not acceptable.
- 5) The applicant will provide proof that the ponds provide adequate detention time to allow the discharge to meet Utah and Federal effluent limitations.
- 6) Neither pond has an oil-skimmer on their emergency spillway and these must be installed.

PacifiCorp Electric Operations is Ordered to make the requisite permit changes in accordance with R614-303.220, and to submit a complete application for permit change to address the findings of permit deficiency within 30 days of receipt of this Order. Approval by the Division must be obtained within 60 days of receipt of this Order. All approvals not obtained within 60 days of receipt of this Order may result in a hindrance violation, unless a request for extension has been approved by the Director.
