1. **PROJECT NAME:** PacifiCorp Underground Right-of-Way Application through Federal coal between the Cottonwood and Trail Mountain Mines.
2. **RESPONSIBLE OFFICIAL:** Forest Supervisor, Manti-La Sal National Forest.
3. **PROPOSAL:** PacifiCorp has applied for an underground right-of-way through approximately 199.66 acres of unleased Federal coal to connect operations of the Cottonwood Mine in federal coal lease U-083066 with the Trail Mountain Mine in federal coal lease U-49332 (see Location Map). A combination of 2,800 feet of three entry system and 3,800 feet of five entry system mining would be used through the right-of-way, within the Hiawatha coal seam. Entries would be approximately 20 feet wide by 8 feet high and 500 to 2,000 feet below the surface. The right-of-way would pass under Cottonwood Creek.

4. **TIERING OPPORTUNITIES:**

USDA Forest Service, Manti-La Sal National Forest Land and Resource Management Plan (LRMP), November 5, 1986, and Environmental Assessment for Coal Lease Application UTU-64375, South Trail Mountain Tract, April, 1990.

5. **OTHER AGENCIES OR PUBLICS INVOLVED:**


The Bureau of Land Management is the responsible agency for administration of coal leases under the Mineral Leasing Act of 1920, as amended, and Federal Regulations 43 CFR 3410.

The Utah Division of Oil, Gas and Mining is the responsible agency for permitting of mining operations under the Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act of 1977 and Federal Regulations 30 CFR 700 to end.

The Forest Service, as the surface management agency, is responsible for evaluation of the proposal under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969. The Forest Supervisor has authority to issue or not issue a Special Use Permit for the proposed right-of-way.

The proposed project is located on the Ferron Ranger District of the Manti-La Sal National Forest. The Ferron Ranger District will prepare the necessary NEPA documentation.

Public comment will be invited through notices in local newspapers and by letter from individuals and organizations which have expressed an interest in the past.

6. POTENTIAL EFFECTS OF THE PROJECT:

- a. The right-of-way would pass beneath Cottonwood Creek, a perennial stream. Subsidence or surface fractures could impact the creek.
- b. The proposed right-of-way passes through the only other reasonable access site for the coal in Trail Mountain. This could create a "captive" coal situation which could decrease the competitiveness of the remaining coal.
- c. The proposal states water encountered during mining could be pumped out of the mine into either Cottonwood Creek or Grimes Wash. Diversion of water between drainages may have impacts to surface water resources.
- d. Other potential effects may be determined during the scoping process.

7. ISSUES:

8. SUGGESTED ALTERNATIVES:

- a. No Action Alternative - Under this alternative the Forest Supervisor would not issue a Special Use Permit for the right-of-way.
- b. Approve the Request - Under this alternative the Forest Supervisor would issue a Special Use Permit for the right-of-way.
- c. Overhead Tube Conveyor - Under this alternative an overhead tube conveyor spanning Cottonwood Creek and located on fee lands would be used in lieu of an underground right-of-way.

9. ANALYSIS AND DECISION CRITERIA:

- a. Consistency with the Manti-La Sal National Forest LRMP.
- b. Consistency with Forest Service Handbook 2709.11, Special Uses Handbook, and Forest Service Manual 2700-2720, Special Uses Management.
- c. The project must be evaluated consistent with the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969.
- d. There are no unacceptable impacts on the environment.
