BACKGROUND

The Cottonwood/Wilberg Mine is located approximately eight miles northwest of Orangeville, Utah on the east side of the Wasatch Plateau Coal Field. The permit area encompasses 11,508 acres comprised of federal coal leases and privately-owned holdings.

This mine was in operation prior to the enactment of SMCRA and the initial permanent program permit was issued to Utah Power and Light Company on July 6, 1984. This permit was subsequently renewed on July 6, 1989 and July 6, 1994.

PERMIT RENEWAL

PacifiCorp made application to the Division of Oil Gas and Mining for a five year permit renewal for the Cottonwood/Wilberg Mine on March 29, 1999. This renewal encompasses the same permit area and disturbance as currently approved in the permit.

The application for permit renewal was submitted on March 29, 1999 and the renewal application was determined administratively complete on April 23, 1999. Public notice for this permit renewal was published in the Emery County Progress on May 18, 25, June 1 and 8, 1999.

ANALYSIS

The permit renewal application was received at least 120 days prior to permit renewal and all notices were published as required. One comment was received but did not materially pertain to this mine permit. No informal conference was requested.

RECOMMENDATION

Approval for this permit renewal is recommended.


- March 29, 1999 PacifiCorp submitted a permit renewal application.
- April 23, 1999 Determination of Administrative Completeness of permit renewal application with the request to post the reclamation liability for the entire permit area. PacifiCorp met with the Division to request a review of this requirement on April 30, 1999. This requirement is currently under administrative review.
- May 18, 25
June 1,
and 8, 1999 Public notice for permit renewal for the Cottonwood/Wilberg Mine published in the Emery County Progress.
- June 23, 1999 Permit renewal completeness determination sent to applicable state, federal, and county agencies with a note that comments must be received by July 6, 1999.
- June 30, 1999 A comment on a hydrologic concern is received from Craig Smith (letter dated June 28, 1999) representing the Huntington-Cleveland Irrigation Company in regard to the Cottonwood/Wilberg Mine permit renewal.
- July 6, 1999 The Associate Director of Mining sends letter to Craig Smith to notify him that the hydrologic concern in his letter, dated June 28, 1999 is not materially connected to this mine permit.
- July 6, 1999 The permit is renewed.


1. The permit renewal term will not exceed the original permit term of five years (R645-303-234).
2. The terms and conditions of the existing permit are being met. (R645-303-233.110).
3. The present coal mining and reclamation operations are in compliance with the environmental protection standards of the Act and the Utah State Program (R645-303-233.120).
4. The requested renewal will not substantially jeopardize the operator's continuing ability to comply with the Act and the Utah State Program (R645-303-233.130).



Sec. 1 STATUTES AND REGULATIONS - This permit is issued pursuant to the Utah Coal Mining and Reclamation Act of 1979, Utah Code Annotated (UCA) 40-10-1 et seq, hereafter referred to as the Act.

This legal description is for the permit area of the Cottonwood/Wilberg Mine. The permittee is authorized to conduct underground coal mining activities and related surface activities on the foregoing described property subject to the conditions of all applicable conditions, laws and regulations.

Sec. 3 COMPLIANCE - The permittee will comply with the terms and conditions of the permit, all applicable performance standards and requirements of the State Program.

Sec. 4 PERMIT TERM - This permit expires on July 6, 2004.

Sec. 5 ASSIGNMENT OF PERMIT RIGHTS - The permit rights may not be transferred, assigned or sold without the approval of the Director, the Division. Transfer, assignment or sale of permit rights must be done in accordance with applicable regulations, including but not limited to 30 CFR 740.13{e} and R645-303-300.

Sec. 6 RIGHT OF ENTRY - The permittee shall allow the authorized representative of the Division, including but not limited to inspectors, and representatives of the Office of Surface Mining Reclamation and Enforcement (OSM), without advance notice or a search warrant, upon presentation of appropriate credentials, and without delay to:

- (a) have the rights of entry provided for in 30 CFR 840.12, R645-400-220, 30 CFR 842.13 and R645-400-110;
- (b) be accompanied by private persons for the purpose of conducting an inspection in accordance with R645-400-100 and R645-400-200 when the inspection is in response to an alleged violation reported to the Division by the private person.

Sec. 7 SCOPE OF OPERATIONS - The permittee shall conduct underground coal mining activities only on those lands specifically designated as within the permit area on the maps submitted in the approved plan and approved for the term of the permit and which are subject to the performance bond.

Sec. 8 ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS - The permittee shall take all possible steps to minimize any adverse impact to the environment or public health and safety resulting from noncompliance with any term or condition of the permit, including, but not limited to:

- (a) Any accelerated or additional monitoring necessary to determine the nature and extent of noncompliance and the results of the noncompliance;
- (b) immediate implementation of measures necessary to comply; and
- (c) warning, as soon as possible after learning of such noncompliance, any person whose health and safety is in imminent danger due to the noncompliance.

Sec. 9 DISPOSAL OF POLLUTANTS - The permittee shall dispose of solids, sludge, filter backwash or pollutants in the course of treatment or control of waters or emissions to the air in the manner required by the approved Utah State Program and the Federal Lands Program which prevents violation of any applicable state or federal law.

Sec. 10 CONDUCT OF OPERATIONS - The permittee shall conduct its operations:

- (a) in accordance with the terms of the permit to prevent significant, imminent environmental harm to the health and safety of the public; and
- (b) utilizing methods specified as conditions of the permit by the Division in approving alternative methods of compliance with the performance standards of the Act, the approved Utah State Program and the Federal Lands Program.

Sec. 11 EXISTING STRUCTURES - As applicable, the permittee will comply with R645-301 and R645-302 for compliance, modification, or abandonment of existing structures.

Sec. 12 RECLAMATION FEE PAYMENTS - The operator shall pay all reclamation fees required by 30 CFR Part 870 for coal produced under the permit, for sale, transfer or use.

Sec. 13 AUTHORIZED AGENT - The permittee shall provide the names, addresses and telephone numbers of persons responsible for operations under the permit to whom notices and orders are to be delivered.

Sec. 14 COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS - The permittee shall comply with the provisions of the Water Pollution Control Act (33 USC 1151 et seq,) and the Clean Air Act (42 USC 7401 et seq), UCA 26-11-1 et seq, and UCA 26-13-1 et seq.

Sec. 15 PERMIT RENEWAL - Upon expiration, this permit may be renewed for areas within the boundaries of the existing permit in accordance with the Act, the approved Utah State Program and the Federal Lands Program.

Sec. 16 CULTURAL RESOURCES - If, during the course of mining operations, previously unidentified cultural resources are discovered, the permittee shall ensure that the site(s) is not disturbed and shall notify the Division. The Division, after coordination with OSM, shall inform the permittee of necessary actions required. The permittee shall implement the mitigation measures required by the Division within the time frame specified by the Division.

Sec. 17 APPEALS - The permittee shall have the right to appeal as provided for under R645-300-200.

The above conditions (Secs. 1-17) are also imposed upon the permittee's agents and employees. The failure or refusal of any of these persons to comply with these conditions shall be deemed a failure of the permittee to comply with the terms of this permit and the lease. The permittee shall require his agents, contractors and subcontractors involved in activities concerning this permit to include these conditions in the contracts between and among them. These conditions may be revised or amended, in writing, by the mutual consent of the Division and the permittee at any time to adjust to changed conditions or to correct an oversight. The Division may amend these conditions at any time without the consent of the permittee in order to make them consistent with any federal or state statutes and any regulations.
