Dear Mr. Daniels;

Pursuant to your letter of Oct. 5, 1983 regarding county roads, it is the position of the Co-op Mining Company that the Bear Canyon road meets the requirements of the regulation. Co-op Mining Co. has signed an agreement with Emery County, which in turn has a right-of-way from BLM for the lower portion of the road. The County and BLM standards for a Class I road equal or exceed the Division standards for a Class I road. Documentation of the aforementioned agreements and standards are included with this letter. The Co-op Mining Company agrees that the upper portion of the road should be permitted with the Division as a Class I haul road and has submitted a plan to the Division for that road that is currently being reviewed by the Division. The mine access road is currently permitted under the interim regulations along with the rest of the permit area, and is being included in the MRP for the permanent permitting that is currently being prepared for submittal.

As you will recall, I contacted you by phone on Oct. 11th by phone and again on Oct. 12th at the Price, Utah meeting, as required in your letter before October 14, 1983.
