At 10:00 a.m. on September 27, 1984, Ken Wyatt and Tom Wright, Mining Field Specialists for the Division arrived in the vicinity of the Bear Creek Canyon Mine. Surveillance of the mine area revealed activity in the form of coal loading and transport.

At 11:00 a.m. an orange dump truck (possibly an old UDOT truck) arrived at the blue entrance gate. The gate normally locked, was opened to allow access for the truck. The truck proceeded to the coal stockpile pad and backed beneath the coal loading chute. The truck was loaded with lump coal from the conveyor and later filled higher by hand labor at the coal stockpile.

This truck then weighed in at the scalehouse and proceeded down canyon entering Highway 31 westward to Fairview. The entire loading and transporting process was photographed. No other coal mining activity was observed until entering the mine site the same afternoon for inspection purposes.
