Please find attached 8 copies of the Ventilation Portal Modification as per your request.

Also, Co-Op requests an extension on (1) Demolition and cleanup at the Trail Canyon site; 27 loads of material have been removed, however, due to frozen conditions which creates a hazard on the steep slopes, Co-Op is requesting that the balance of the demolition be completed by August 1, 1987; and (2) Topsoil stockpiling Bear Canyon Mine Ball Park area; Co-Op hauled 14 loads of topsoil to the ball park site, and additional 28 loads are required to complete the area. The delay is a result of construction problems associated with the RACO loadout site. Their problems have been corrected at this time, however, due to frozen ground, topsoil removal has been delayed until spring 1987. Co-Op anticipated completion of hauling by July 30, 1987, and requests an extension until said date.
