Dear Mr. Reynolds,

On January 16th, 2007, C.W. Mining submitted one hard copy as well as six digital copies (CD's) of the entire Bear Canyon Mining and Reclamation Plan (MRP) with redlined text. In the last technical analysis provided to you (dated December 11, 2006) the Division of Oil, Gas and Mining (the Division) requested that an entire copy of the updated MRP be submitted for review. The request was made in order to insure that all revisions produced during the Bear Canyon Lease Addition permitting process were incorporated into the plan.

As you know, there have been four formal iterations conducted and numerous revisions/changes produced during this process to date. The Division felt it necessary at this point to review the entire plan, with all revisions/changes included, prior to issuance of final approval of the proposed lease addition. Upon receipt of the aforementioned hard and digital copies, Division personnel began their review of the documents. It became apparent that the digital and hard copies did not match. In addition, there were instances where revisions that had been previously agreed upon by the respective agencies and C.W. Mining were simply not included in either the digital or hard copy.

On Friday, January 19th, Division personnel reported the situation to C.W. Mining representatives. New updated pages and discs were hand delivered to our office that afternoon. Upon review of the material, Division personnel discovered that there were again conflicts and problems with the January 19, 2007 information.


As such, as of today, the Division has suspended its review of the Bear Canyon Mine's proposed lease addition information packages. The review process will resume upon receiving confirmation from C.W. Mining that all efforts have been made to double check the material being provided to the Division and that all the necessary corrections have been made to both the digital and hard copies.
