I am not quite sure what you want. During the site visit all staff members said that existing cultural resource, vegetation, and soil studies would be adequate. Also a detailed description of soil removal, stockpiling and seeding for final distribution, and pre and post mining land use is included in the current MRP. Do you want the information submitted with every single amendment. Also Geology doesn't apply to the amendment, it doesn't include any changes to underground workings. Or maybe you want us to included this addition as an appendix and then reference those areas. This doesn't make sense either because then you would have text talking about the bath house pad construction and reclamation spread throughout the entire MRP. If this was done with every single amendment they MRP would become very confusing and difficult to find stuff. Right now our MRP is very organized and easy to find information, it simply follows your regulations so if you want to see if it is addressed you turn to the reg number in our MRP. I think having stuff pertaining to a single reg spread throughout the MRP is a bad idea. It is much simpler and easy to review if it is all together.

- > The information in the application is not adequate to proceed with a review of the amendment at this time. The following information is required:
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- > A detailed description of the amendment including references to maps that will be revised as a result of the increased disturbance.
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- > A detailed description of the soils including soil type, removal, stockpiling, seeding and redistribution for final reclamation.
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- > Land Use, pre and post mining, Air quality, Cultural Resources, Geology and Biology sections of the regulations need to be addressed.
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- > The applicant may refer to information in the MRP that is relevant to the proposed action such as a cultural resource or vegetation survey that includes the proposed surface disturbance.
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
