Dear Sir:

This letter is concerning Genwal Coal Company's Crandall Canyon Mine. At the present time there are no toilet or sewage facilities at the mine. Section 3.2.7 of the Permit Application states that portable chemical toilets will be used. The permit was approved with no stipulations concerning this item.

The Forest Service's Decision Notice and Finding of No Significant Impact required that the management requirements specified in Alternative Two of the Environmental Analysis be followed. Management Requirement Number 10 requires that an adequate sewage disposal plan be submitted and when approved be adhered to.

The Code of Federal Regulations, Title 30, Part 75.1712 requires that bath houses and toilet facilities be provided. The regulations require a minimum of one toilet for each ten miners. The regulations also require compliance with applicable local and State regulations.

Executive Order 12088, Federal Compliance with Pollution Control Standards, October 13, 1978 requires all Federal agencies to take all necessary actions to prevent environmental pollution on all Federal facilities and activities under agency control in full cooperation with State and local governments.

We request that the Division of Oil, Gas and Mining take action to ensure that adequate toilet and sewer facilities are provided at the Crandall Canyon Mine.
