RE: Non-Coal Waste Disposal Plan, Genwal Coal Company, Crandall Canyon Mine, ACT/015/032, Emery County, Utah

In order for Genwal to receive approval for off-site disposal of non-coal waste, the following information must be submitted:

1. A letter from State Health, providing the permit number for the landfill, the permit term and any conditions that State Health has concerning disposal of non-coal mine waste in the landfill.
2. A map showing the location of the landfill and the landfill permit boundaries.
3. A description of how the material is to be placed in the landfill, including what means or measures are to be used to protect both surface and groundwater hydrology in accordance with Title 40-10-18(2)(d) of the Utah Code.
4. The landfill must be an approved sanitary landfill and operation of the landfill must be in accordance with all local, State and Federal requirements as addressed under UMC 817.89(b). The operator must commit to compliance with these requirements, and shall not dispose of non-coal wastes in the landfill when or if the landfill is not operating under the approval of these agencies.

Upon receipt of the above information, the Division shall inspect the landfill site in order to determine that the site is suitable for disposal of non-coal wastes and in compliance with the intent of the Regulations. Upon favorable review of the site inspection, the Division shall approve the landfill for disposal.
