The Utah Preservation Office has received for consideration the above referenced project. After consideration of the material, our office believes that the plan for the Genwal Coal Company adequately mitigates site 42Em722, with provisions of fencing per United States Forest Service instructions. No other significant resources are present in the project area.

One technical comment, please note that the State Historic Preservation Officer has not granted cultural resource clearance, for example as mentioned in Chapter 5, Part 5.3, but we concur with the determination of no effect by the U.S. Forest Service. This is a very important, the Preservation Office has no authority to clear any part of the National Historic Preservation Act, that is a function of the federal agencies involved.
