Re: Approval of Changes in 1986 Contemporaneous Revegetation Plan,
Crandall Canyon Mine, ACT/015/032, Folder No. 4 and 14,
Emery County, Utah


As discussed on the phone between yourself and Lynn Kunzler on October 21, 1986, approval is granted to use alfalfa hay mulch as a substitute for curlex on 28,000 square feet of more than 30% slope (area between substation pad and lower pad, and between the roads). The rate of hay application will be 2,000 to 2,500 lbs for this site (3,000 to 4,000 lbs/acre). Mulch will be anchored to the slope by overlaying the hay with a polypropylene net and stapled to the soil at 3-4 foot centers. While the Division is approving this change in mulching technique, please note that should vegetation and litter cover fall below 80% ground cover additional reseeding and/or mulching will be required.

With regards to the plans to remove coal fines from historically disturbed areas to increase vegetation cover, the Division concurs that this action has negative effects on existing vegetation and that attempts to establish additional vegetation by seeding these areas "as is" and mulching as described above is the preferred alternative at this time. Approval is hereby granted to make this change.
