
Re: Approval of Second Time Extension Request, Temporary/Portable On-site Coal Processing/Screening Facility, Genval Coal Company, Crandall Canyon Mine, ACT/015/032-87D, Folder #3, Emery County, Utah

On February 4, 1988, the Division received your letter requesting another time extension for continued use of the temporary coal processing and truck loading facility at the Crandall Canyon mine site. The Division's January 4, 1988 letter granted a 60-day time extension for continued use of the temporary screening facility. The 60-day extension expired on February 3, 1988.

The United States Forest Service (USFS) has granted Genval Coal Company (Genval) an extension of time to use the temporary facilities until June 1, 1988. The Division hereby grants its approval for Genval to continue using the temporary screening facility. This approval will remain in effect until the permanent onsite coal processing and truck loading facility is approved and constructed, or until June 1, 1988, whichever occurs first. It is unlikely that the Division will grant any further extension of time for use of the temporary facility.
