Summary

The Mohrland Screening and Crushing Facility plan, received May 18, 1988, has been reviewed for completeness and adequacy for soil information, soil management, backfilling and grading information, prime farmland investigation and alluvial valley floors. The information and plans for these concerned sections are considered adequate for approval.

Analysis

The entire proposed site is presently and historically been disturbed, covered with coal, and currently being used as a coal loadout facility. The post-mining land use will be returned back to the present loadout facility. The proposed site will not be altered to accommodate the temporary processing facility. Because no soil exists that is worth saving or protecting, no soil survey or management designs are necessary. Based on an April 21, 1988 field site review, the Division has determined that no prime farmland or alluvial valley floors will be impacted by the proposed temporary facility.
