

On November 19, 1991 the Division received a submittal from the law firm of LeBoef, Lamb, Leiby and MacRae which completed your requirements for transfer of permit rights to IPA. The public notification and comment period has ended with no comments received. The Division has conducted a 510(c) check for both IPA and Genwal Coal Company on the Applicant Violator System with a resultant recommendation to "issue". You are hereby notified that the transfer is approved.

You should now proceed to amend your Mining and Reclamation plan accordingly. Appropriate replacement pages, including but not limited to the list of corporate officers, surface and coal ownership maps, lease ownership descriptions, should all be updated and submitted for insertion to your mining and reclamation plan.
