Re: Final Approval of Amendment 92C, Denial of Amendment 91C, Genwal Coal Company, Crandall Canyon Mine, ACT/015/032/ Folder #3, Emery County, Utah

The Division is reviewing amendments which may still be outstanding. We have determined that Amendment 92C (Mining Change and Subsidence effects) was conditionally approved on April 28, 1992. The conditions were satisfied on May 18, 1992 with your submittal of revised Chapter 14 information. This letter signifies final approval of Amendment 92C. The May 18, 1992 submittal has been identified as Amendment 92F and is currently under review. The Division should notify you shortly of any deficiencies with the revised Chapter 14 (Amendment 92F).

The original submittals to satisfy Chapter 14 stipulations were made in 1991 and were identified as Amendment 91C. These submittals have all since been superseded by Amendment 92F. Therefore, since Amendment 91C is no longer current it is hereby denied. Amendment 92F is being reviewed in its place.

At the present time the Division is reviewing 4 amendments to your Mining and Reclamation Plan. They are as follows:

1. Amendment 91A---Revised Chapter 7
2. Amendment 91F---Revised Chapter 3
3. Amendment 92F---Chapter 14 update
4. Amendment 92H---Revised Chapter 8
