Dear Mr. Haddock:

Genwal is proposing asphaltting the portal road from the upper pad to the portal area. By paving the portal road, dust emissions will be reduced, road maintenance will be reduced, and better access to the portal area will exist.

The hydrologic impact from paving this road has been evaluated by Blackhawk Engineering of Helper, Utah and is attached to this letter. It has been determined that there will be no required change in the hydraulic structures that will be directly influenced due to the proposed action. Therefore, Appendix 7-11 of the Mine and Reclamation Plan need not be revised.

Please find enclosed Fourteen (14) copies of the revised Plate 5-10 showing the cross section of the Portal Pad road which reflects 4 inches of Bituminous road mix.

The costs of reclaiming the additional 4 inches of bituminous road mix is estimated to be less than two (2) percent of the total bond amount of \$703,000. These costs can easily be absorbed within the contingency amounts figured into our bond.


