


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PUBLIC NOTICE

Cleveland Town will hold one rabies clinic on Sat., Feb. 22, 2003 from 1:00 PM to 3:00 PM at the Cleveland Cemetery storage building, 200 N. 600 E., in Cleveland. All dog owners are informed that they have until Feb. 28, 2003 to license their dogs for the year. Persons failing to obtain a license through the town will be subject to a fine of \$15.00 in addition to the following fees. This late fee will be enforced as of March 1, 2003.

- Each unneutered male \$15.00
- Each unspayed female \$15.00
- Each neutered male \$ 5.00
- Each spayed female \$ 5.00

All dogs over four months of age, within the Cleveland Town limits must obtain a license. Proof of current rabies vaccination must be presented before a license can be issued.

School Board Meets at Cottonwood

Emery County School Board met their regular meeting at Cottonwood Elementary on Feb. 5. Board members in attendance were Laurel Johanson, Sam Singleton, Marie Johnson and Royd Hatt. Superintendent Kristin Sitterud and Business Administrator Ross Huntington were also present. The meeting began with agenda items, minutes, warrants, consent items. These items were provided.

Principal Dennis Jones began report to the board by expressing appreciation to the board for their continuing support of the peer-tutoring program. This program teams a first grade student tutor with a second grade student. After training the tutor, work begins with the second grade student. The second grade student has been tested and it was discovered they have made a years progress in a few months since school began.

Jones also reported that Teri and Lynda Nelson, teachers at Cottonwood school, have been trained in the Block reading program that is currently being implemented. Lori Labrum is currently receiving literacy training. Jones explained that they have discovered that most learning does not come from the students completing assignments, but from the levels of what they are reading. The faculty has made it their goal to have the students read and comprehend more to increase the students' reading capabilities. Up to this point,

SOUTH CRANDALL CANYON COAL LEASE TRACT

Elaine Zieroth, Forest Supervisor, Manti-La Sal National Forest, has decided to consent to leasing of the South Crandall Canyon Coal Lease Tract by the BLM (Bureau of Land Management). Sally Wisely, BLM Utah State Director, has decided to offer the tract for competitive sale. The respective decisions are documented in a Joint DN/FONSI (Decision Notice/Finding of No Significant Impact) prepared by these officials. Under the selected leasing alternative, the lease will contain special stipulations for the protection of non-coal interests.

This 880-acre coal tract was proposed by Genwal Coal Company to add coal reserves to their Crandall Canyon Mine. Genwal will deplete their current coal reserves within approximately 2 years. The tract could extend the life of the mine by approximately 8 years. It is located directly east of State Coal Lease ML-48258, south of the Crandall Canyon Mine in Crandall Canyon, on the Manti-La Sal National Forest described as:

- T. 16 S., R. 7 E., SLM, Emery County, Utah
- Section 4: W1/2SW1/4, S1/2SW1/4NW1/4;
- Section 5: SE1/4, S1/2SE1/4NE1/4;
- Section 8: E1/2, NE1/4NW1/4, S1/2NW1/4;
- Section 9: NW1/4.

The Forest Service decision is subject to appeal pursuant to Forest Service regulations at 36 CFR 215.7. Any written appeal must be postmarked or received by the Appeal Deciding Officer within 45 days of publication of this notice in the *Sun Advocate*, Price River, Utah. The appeal Deciding Officer is Regional Forester, Intermountain Region, 324 25th Street, Ogden UT 84401. Appeals must meet the content requirements of 36 CFR 215.14. The decision is also subject to appeal by the applicant pursuant to 36 CFR 251, as stated in the DN/FONSI.

The BLM decision is subject to appeal in part or full, to the Board of Land Appeals, Office of the Secretary, in accordance with the regulations at 43 CFR Part 4. If an appeal is taken, your notice of appeal must be filed at Office of the Solicitor (see 43 CFR 4.413) within 30 calendar days following the expiration of the compliance period. The appellant has the burden of showing that the decision appealed from is in error.
