Thanks for the copy of the letter. For the following issues the mine is planning to place concrete block stoppings in the portals to prohibit entrance by unauthorized persons. Also, they said metal portal barricades or barred doors, along with a chain link fence, and an onsite 7 day 24 hr guard will be used to restrict access to the stoppings. Also, they will plan to use a system of above floor ditches to direct underground water flow to the existing mine discharge system.


Dear Mr. Shaver:

This letter is to remind you of the requirements to notify the Division if there are temporary cessation of coal mine operations, R645-301-515.300 to R645-301-515.321. As required by R645-301-320:

*Before temporary cessation of coal mining and reclamation operations for a period of 30 days or more, or as soon as it is known that a temporary cessation will extend beyond 30 days, each person who conducts coal mining and reclamation operations will submit to the Division a notice of intention to cease or abandon operations. This notice will include a statement of the exact number of surface acres and the horizontal and vertical extent of subsurface strata which have been in the permit area prior to cessation or abandonment, the extent and kind of reclamation of surface area which will have been accomplished and identification of the backfilling, regarding, revegetation, environmental monitoring, underground opening closure and water treatment activities that will continue during the temporary cessation.*
