In talking with the staff about the revisions to the Forest Service's Special use Permit for the Crandall Canyon/East Mountain access road, some questions came up regarding what's meant by "on-lease ". For clarification to the rest of the staff, could you respond to this e-mail as to the Forest Service's interpretation of what "on-lease" means. It's my understanding that "on-lease" refers to the entire Crandall Canyon SMCRA permit area. Did I understand you correctly?

p.s. Here is the proposed Forest Service Special Use Permit language change;

*"Reclamation of the Forest Service road shall be completed immediately after it is evident that **on-lease** pad reclamation is determined to be stable and no earth moving equipment is needed. Upon completion of reclamation, a determination by the Forest Service will be made as to whether or not to leave the gate and fence. If it is determined to leave the gate and fence, the permittee shall be responsible for maintenance for the permit duration."*
