Daron...As we discussed on Friday, we would like to request a continuation of the Division's previous approval to utilize the Crandall Canyon sediment pond for temporary storage of the iron sludge. In our final response to Citation 10073 (which I intend to hand deliver the clean copies on Thursday), we have added language agreed upon with Steve Christensen that the company acknowledges that within 60 days of the approval of the Burma Evaporation Basin the Division will then rescind all authority for future use of the Crandall sediment pond for iron sludge disposal. Please note that this temporary use will be under the same conditions and restrictions of the previous Division authorization. Please also note that today we received the green light from the Division to initiate the public notice process for the Burma basin facility. I intend to submit to you tomorrow a draft notice for your approval. We appreciate your consideration of this request.
