#### **NOTICE TO WATER USERS**

A Notice of Intent for the following project submitted in accordance with R307-401-1, Utah Administrative Code (UAC), has been received for consideration by the Director: Company Name: Alton Coal Development, LLC Location: Alton Coal Development, LLC-Coal Hollow Mine – County Road 136, Alton, UT, Kane County Project Description: Alton Coal Development, LLC (ACD) has requested a modification to Approval Order DAQE-140470004-15 to continue mining activities on a 284 acre private lease area called the North Private Lease (NPL). The NPL area is approximately 1.4 miles north of the existing Coal Hollow Mine (CHM) and will be included as part of the current mining operation at the CHM. The mining activities will consist of coal removal including extraction (open pit and highwall mining), loading and hauling the coal to the CHM via haul trucks, and dumping raw coal onto a stockpile (dumping activities are the same as current operations). The CHM area will only operate the coal processing plant and underground mining operation at this location as surface mining activities are complete. ACD coal mine is classified as a minor source. The ACD mining operation, which includes the NPL and CHM areas, is located in Kane County near the town of Alton, Utah. Kane County is an attainment area of the National Ambient Air Quality Standards for all pollutants. New Source Performance Standards 40 CFR 60 Subparts A (General Provisions), Y (Standards of Performance for Coal Processing Plants) and IIII (Standards of Performance for Stationary Compression Ignition Internal Combustion Engines) regulations apply to this source. National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants 40 CFR 63 Subparts A (General Provisions) and ZZZZ (Stationary Reciprocating Internal Combustion Engines) regulations apply to this source. Title V of the 1990 Clean Air Act applies to this area source. The emission changes due to relocated surface mining activities and accounting for new operating parameters, in tons per year, will be as follows: PM10 = -20.94, PM2.5 (subset of PM10) = 3.69\*, NOx = 5.36, SO2 = 2.59, CO = -3.98, VOC = -1.93 and HAPs = -0.63. The potential source emissions (NPL and CHM areas combined), in tons per year, are as follows: PM10 = 47.74 (fugitive & point source), PM2.5 (subset of PM10) = 11.99, NOx = 36.67, SO2 = 6.70, CO = 29.04, VOC = 3.89, HAPs = 0.33 and CO2e = 12,341.95. Note: PM2.5 emissions were not previously accounted for in some operations. Therefore PM2.5 shows as an increase in source emissions. The completed engineering evaluation and air quality impact analysis showed that the proposed project meets the requirements of federal air quality regulations and the State air quality rules. The Director intends to issue an Approval Order pending a 30-day public comment period. The project proposal, estimate of the effect on local air quality and draft Approval Order

are available for public inspection and comment at the Utah Division of Air Quality, 195 North 1950 West, Salt Lake City, UT 84116. Written comments received by the Division at this same address on or before October 31, 2015 will be considered in making the final decision on the approval/disapproval of the proposed project. If anyone so requests to the Director in writing within 15 days of publication of this notice, a hearing will be held in accordance with R307-401-7, UAC. Under Section 19-1-301.5, a person who wishes to challenge a Permit Order may only raise an issue or argument during an adjudicatory proceeding that was raised during the public comment period and was supported with sufficient information or documentation to enable the Director to fully consider the substance and significance of the issue.
