When OSM performed their "apparent completeness review" of the Convulsion Canyon Mine Plan Addendum, Coastal States Energy Company was requested to submit additional cultural resource data. That portion of these additional data prepared by our consultant, AERC, was included as part of the amendment delivered to your office on November 26, 1980. However, item 783.12(b) of the OSM review requested that the applicant also provide documentation from the Utah State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) concurring with our consultant's determination of ineligibility of the Addley Monument for listing on The National Register of Historic Places (see Vol. 4, Archaeology Section, page 42).

A copy of the AERC documents, complete with site reports, was submitted to the Utah State Historical Society on November 11, 1980 for their review. The SHPO reply was received too late to be included in the M&RP amendment; consequently, a copy of their concurrence is here-with attached in fulfillment of the OSM request.
