Summary:

On September 8, 1988, The Division received the referenced weed control plan. This plan was reviewed and found to be adequate for approval.

Analysis:

UII intends to control an infestation of field bindweed, a state designated noxious weed, using appropriate herbicides. The proposed rate is within the suggested rate of the state weed control specialist. However, if conflicts with the rate vs. package label exist, the label requirements will be followed. Applications will be made during times when the plants are growing actively (fall and spring).

Recommendations:

It is recommended that the proposed weed control plan be approved.
