RE: Incidental Boundary Change Request

Dear Mr. Braxton:

Southern Utah Fuel Company is in the process of preparing the foundation and base for the Run-Of-Mine Stockpile. As you know, this facility is to be constructed during the next few months. We will have approximately 5,000 cubic yards of subsoil and rock that will be extra at this time as a result of excavations associated with the project. This material is 100% noncoal. There are no toxic or man-made materials mixed in with it. We have sampled the material for both toxic and topsoil-substitute characteristics. Analyses will be forwarded to you as soon as we receive them.

We propose to transport this material to a location adjacent to our Waste Rock Disposal Area on our 40 acre tract located along the county road leading to the mine. It will be embanked and seeded. Run-off from the material will not be routed through the sedimentation pond since it is not coal waste and not mine development waste. However, we will ensure that run-off is routed through silt fences, straw bales, or other sediment control devices to prevent sediment transport to the natural drainage channels in the area. We would expect the pile to be regularly inspected by your office under small area exemption criteria. A map showing the proposed location is enclosed.

The material will remain in storage for several years and may be used in final reclamation of the minesite. Lynn Findlay, of the Fishlake National Forest Supervisors office, has inspected both the material and the proposed storage location. He is checking on their policy regarding storage of forest material on private property but said he believes there will not be a problem.

I understand that the relocation of this material can be approved by your office as an Incidental Boundary Change. Please approve this plan to dispose of excess rock and subsoil under those provisions.
