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

Dear Ms. Linner:

In the on-site Mid-Permit Term Review meeting that was held at SUFCo on September 27, 1989, three areas of the MRP were flagged as needing to be addressed prior to December 1, 1989 as part of the mid-term review. These areas are:

- 1) Alternative Sediment Control Areas (ASCAS),
- 2) Surface and Groundwater Monitoring, and
- 3) Subsidence.

Materials are enclosed to update the existing MRP to cover ASCAS delineated in the Mid-Permit Term Review. These updates are designed to replace existing pages. An insertion guide is included to insure proper updating.

Surface and groundwater monitoring programs are covered in the existing MRP. The initial program for the minesite is contained in Table H5, Hydrology Section, Pg. 28, Volume 4. These monitoring requirements were revised in 1981. The current schedule is contained in the 1981 Submittal pg. 20, Volume 4. The surface and groundwater monitoring programs for the waste rock disposal site are found on pg. 48, Volume 9.

The subsidence program was updated in 1986. Darron Haddock informed Wess Sorenson that the Division's MRP's in Salt Lake City and Price do not contain this update. The 1986 update addresses the concerns raised by the regulatory authority in the Mid-Permit Term review. The 1986 subsidence revision package is included with an insertion guide to insure proper updating. Note Maps 80-9B and 80-10B are current maps from the 1988 Subsidence Report.

Three copies of the revisions for Alternate Sediment Control Areas and Subsidence are included. We trust these revisions will meet with your approval. Additional copies for your distribution to governmental agencies will be submitted after the Division approves the revisions.
