### 4. HYDROLOGIC BALANCE

**a) Diversions**--The ditches and culverts in the pad area and the main bypass culvert inlets were unobstructed and in good condition. All culverts appeared to be functional. The undisturbed ditch on the upper road and the undisturbed ditch behind the the warehouse were functional, but both were in need of maintenance (i.e., removal of debris and redefinition of embankments).

**b) Sediment Ponds and Impoundments**--The Main Sediment Pond and the Concrete Sediment Trap contained water. The Waste Rock Disposal Site Pond was completely dry. The embankments of both the Main Sediment Pond and the Waste Rock Disposal Site Pond were in good condition.

### 13. REVEGETATION

The test plot above the main coal storage area was observed. The test plot is now ready for seeding with the final reclamation seed mix. Seeding is expected to be done within the next week.
