**LEGAL NOTICE**

*ACT 1041/000 #2*

The Manti-La Sal National Forest and the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) will be conducting an environmental analysis to evaluate the Pines Coal Lease Tract (UTU-76195) proposed by Canyon Fuel Company, LLC. The Office of Surface Mining will participate as a cooperating agency. As the surface management agency, the Forest Service will be the lead Federal agency for preparation of the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). Scoping was originally initiated on October 16, 1997 for preparation of an Environmental Assessment. However, due to the growing public interest in coal leasing on the Wasatch Plateau and complexity of issues raised during the initial scoping effort, Forest Supervisor Janette Kaiser has decided to bypass preparation of an Environmental Assessment and prepare an EIS.

The tract lies in Sanpete, Sevier, and Emery Counties, immediately east of the company's existing SUFCO Mine. It consists of approximately 7,311 acres of National Forest System Lands within the Ferron-Price Ranger District of the Manti-La Sal National Forest. The lands proposed for leasing have been determined to be available for further consideration of coal leasing in the BLM and Forest Service Land Use Plans. The lease application will be processed according to the BLM lease-by-application procedures (43 CFR 3425).

The EIS will include an analysis of impacts associated with leasing the tract, and will consider the potential impacts of mining the tract under two conceptual underground mining scenarios. One scenario would assume mining the tract through Canyon Fuel's adjacent underground workings associated with their SUFCO Mine (requiring no new portal facilities). If a company other than Canyon Fuel should obtain the lease through the competitive bidding, new surface facilities would be required in Link Canyon to mine the tract. Alternatives for analysis and decisions could also include a proposal from Canyon Fuel to mine under and subside Box Canyon (within the existing SUFCO Mine permit area) and a proposal to modify adjacent Federal Coal Lease U-63214 by adding 150 acres for mining.

The Forest Service is inviting public comments for the purpose of identifying issues and alternatives that will be evaluated in the environmental analysis. Parties with specific issues or concerns may submit comments to the Manti-La Sal National Forest, 599 W. Price River Drive, Price, Utah 84501 by close of business March 2, 1998. Additional information can be obtained by contacting Carter Reed or Liane Mattson at the Forest Supervisor's Office in Price, Utah, (435)637-2817. If you have already commented during the initial scoping effort regarding preparation of an Environmental Assessment, your comments will be considered, however you are invited to submit additional comments at this time.

If requested, a copy of all comments received in response to project scoping will be made available to the public. This will include names, addresses, and any other personal information provided with the comments.

1. **Federal**
  - a. U.S. Senate for a six (6) year term.
  - b. U.S. House of Representatives. Third District, for a two (2) year term. The Third Congressional District consists of Carbon, Daggett, Duchesne, Garfield, Grand, Kane, Morgan, Piute, part of Salt Lake, San Juan, San Sevier, Summitt, Uintah, Utah, Wasatch, and Wayne Counties.
2. **State**
  - a. House of Representatives. One member of the House of Representatives for each legislative districts numbered 69, 70, and 71 for a two (2) year term. District 70 includes a portion of Emery County.
3. **County**
  - a. Two (2) County Commissioners for a term of four (4) years.
  - b. County Assessor for a term of four (4) years.
  - c. County Attorney for a term of four (4) years.
  - d. County Clerk/Auditor for a term of four (4) years.
  - e. County Recorder for a term of four (4) years.
  - f. County Sheriff for a term of four (4) years.
  - g. County Treasurer for a term of four (4) years.
4. **School Boards**
  - a. State School Board. One member from State School Board District Three for a four (4) year term. District includes Emery, Juab, Sanpete, Tooele and Utah Counties.
  - b. Local School Board. One member for a four (4) year term from each local Representative Precincts #4 and #5.
5. **Judicial**
  - a. Supreme Court. There will be a retention election statewide for three Supreme Court Justices provided that the incumbents whose terms are expiring file during the filing period.
  - b. Court of Appeals. There will be a retention election statewide for one Court of Appeals Judge provided that the incumbent whose term is expiring files during the filing period.
  - c. District Court. There will be a retention election for District Court Judges in the Seventh Judicial District provided that the incumbent(s) whose terms expire during the filing period.
  - d. County Justice Court. There will be a retention election for County Justice Court Judges in precincts #1 and #2 provided that the incumbents file during the filing period.
