Mr. Clem Cafarelli of this company called the Division today in response to the beginning of an investigation of his actions by the Utah Attorney General. The Division asked the Attorney General to determine if Utah Coal and Energy was in violation of 40-8-9(3) by willfully or knowingly omitting or causing to be omitted from his mining and reclamation plan certain information which is essential to the State in reviewing said plan.

The file indicated that Mr. Cafarelli has been contacted by letter four times and not once has a written response been received from his company. A mining and reclamation plan was begun by Mr. Cafarelli last December (1977) after the Board directed him to prepare same. This same plan was left uncompleted by Mr. Cafarelli; he now claims that his engineer, Mr. Shannon (581-0631), was directed to submit the needed materials. The Division never received any materials from Mr. Shannon and in fact reminded Mr. Cafarelli on December 7, 1977 three weeks after his verbal commitment to comply fully, that his mining and reclamation plan filing was yet incomplete.

Mr. Cafarelli today, September 26, 1978, committed to having his engineer re-submit the reclamation plans and discuss other materials that are needed to fulfill the performance standards under Public law 95-87. Mr. Cafarelli further stated that his, and his engineer's activities to seek reclamation plan approval would begin on September 27, 1978.

Ron Daniels informed Mr. Cafarelli that the Attorney General's investigation would continue until adequate plans are received by the Division.
