

Compliance Schedule
Addendum to data submitted December 29, 1978.

Utah Coal & Energy, Inc., through Sandra N. Peuler, its attorney-in fact, hereby agrees to undertake the following procedures with respect to the reclamation of the area surrounding the Black Hawk Coal Mine, Summit County, State of Utah.

1. To build sedimentation treatment facility if testing by Division of Oil, Gas, & Mining reveals capacity of gravel pad is less than adequate to handle rainfall.
2. To stabilize areas which will not be disturbed during course of mining, specifically the outside slopes of the pad, topsoil storage area, and unstable ground above the portal. Plans are to reseed said areas as follows: hydroseeding and applying wood fiber mulch at 1500 pounds per acre; fertilizer at a rate of 50 pounds per acre (ammonium nitrate or urea); up to 18 pounds of seed per acre, species and application rate as per recommendation of James W. Smith, Reclamation Soils Specialist.
3. To monitor Chalk Creek, above and below the disturbed area and take a total dissolved solids count, monthly.
4. To monitor ground water as follows:
 - (a) monitor water made in the mine
 - (b) make surface reconnaissance for springs; if any are found, monitor during Fall and Spring.
 - (c) during period of drilling by Wescar, if substantial ground water is encountered, well will be cased and used as a ground water monitoring station.
5. To add the approximate location of proposed third portal to the plans.
