Regarding the spring and seepage search: (06/28/87)

1. This spring was running, but only very little. It was the only spring we found. As a general guess, there was approximately .25/gallon per minute. Put in terms of the real world, there was a little puddle that a dog would have had a tough time getting a drink out of and quite a bit of moisture.

The three marks I have circled on the map were unlocated. At the point where we thought they were on the land as compared to the map there was sign of water (cottonwoods, willows, etc.) and water paths. There was no moisture there. However, just to the east about 1/3 mile or so, there was almost swamp land. I don't know if it was from diversion from the creek because we couldn't see anything or if it was the evasive springs we were looking for.


The other three springs in the same area were dry. There was water path and foilage where they should and could have been but no moisture.

We neglected the three you said were in the creek.
