1. Permits. The operator was reminded of permit commitments to sample vegetation cover of the reference area and to have a determination of the range condition of the VRA made. The operator was instructed that if this was impossible to accomplish within the next two to three weeks, a modification should be sent to the Division requesting an extension of time.

4a. Stream Channel Diversions. Sediment was being trapped behind straw bales that had been placed in this diversion. The operator was instructed to maintain the sediment control and clean out trapped sediment before it had accumulated to the point where the straw bales would not function as intended. It was also recommended that the slide area (the apparent source for most of the sediment) be seeded with a fast-growing cover such as yellow sweetclover this fall to reduce sediment loading of the diversion until such time that the slide is stable and can be permanently revegetated.

9. Protection of Fish, Wildlife and Related Environmental Values. The approved Mining and Reclamation Plan identifies an area that will be fenced to exclude domestic grazing as part of the wildlife mitigation plan. The operator has purchased the materials for the fence, although it has not yet been installed (The landowner told the mine that he wanted to install the fence). While the permit does not identify a date for having the fence installed, it was agreed that the fence would be installed by September 15, 1987.
