Re: Approval for Permit Revision-Incidental Boundary Change, Summit Coal Company, Boyer Mine, ACT/043/008, Folder #3 and #2, Summit County, Utah

The Division is prepared to grant a conditional approval for the incidental boundary change discussed and reviewed at the Boyer Mine on Monday, April 11, 1988. The approval will become final upon meeting the following condition:

Condition #1-RS


The applicant must submit seven (7) copies prior to April 26, 1988, of the revised drawing(s) for direct insertion into the Mining and Reclamation Plan (MRP). All applicable drawings in the MRP should be revised to depict the changes in the permit area. The hydrology maps should be revised to additionally include the delineation of the Small Area Exemptions and location of the treatment structures discussed in the technical analysis and depicted on the draft map reviewed in your office. All items discussed in your office and depicted on the draft revision map should be included with this submittal.

Additionally, a proposed revision to the MRP should be submitted reflecting the change in the use of the area identified as the powder magazine and access road. The original MRP contained plans for a catch basin to be constructed at the site and intent to utilize this area as a waste disposal area. The revision should withdraw these proposals, commit to maintaining interim sediment control measures, and contain plans and a commitment to reclamation of this area this season.
