The reclamation of the abandoned Summit #1 coal mine and the interests of the affected landowners and adjacent property owners have been the subject of much discussion since at least 1992. The Division is committed to the successful reclamation of the Summit mine, and is aware that the interests of the owners of the mined land and those of the owners of adjacent property are important. You indicate in your letter that you have a deeded right of way across the mined area which is recorded in Summit County. I would request that you provide us with copies of the deed or deeds creating the right of way you mention, and all documentation which would show an ownership, right of way or other legal interest in the bridge, so that we can evaluate the access situation.


